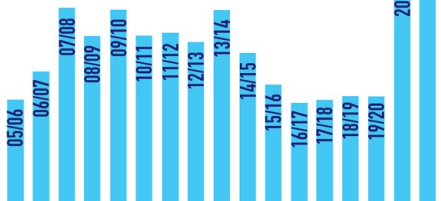

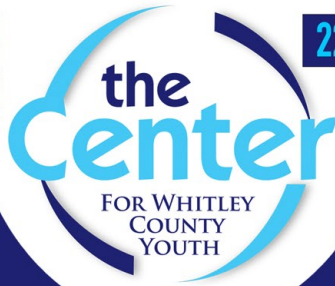

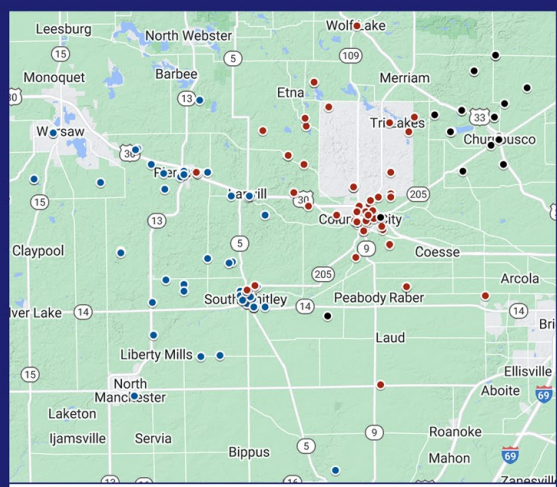
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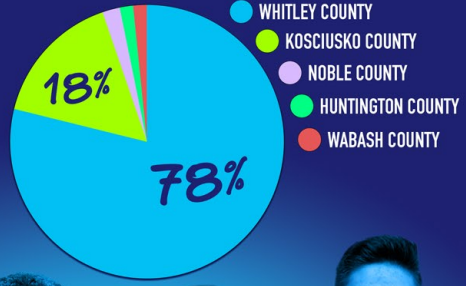

CORY'S STORY >>>>>

CORY STARTED COMING TO ASC AT THE BEGINNING OF HIS 7TH GRADE YEAR. IT WAS HIS FIRST YEAR AT WHITKO AND HE DIDN'T KNOW ANYONE AT THE SCHOOL. ASC PROVIDED HIM WITH A SAFE PLACE TO MEET NEW FRIENDS. BOTH CORY AND HIS MOM EQUATE HIS HAPPINESS AT WHITKO LARGELY TO ASC AND HAVE SAID MULTIPLE TIMES THAT HE NEVER WOULD HAVE ACCLIMATED AS WELL TO THE NEW SCHOOL WITHOUT US. CORY IS NOW GOING INTO HIS

FRESHMAN YEAR OF HIGH SCHOOL AS A SERVE STUDENT, & HE WANTS TO HELP PROVIDE A SAFE SPACE FOR OTHER STUDENTS WHO ARE LOOKING FOR A NEW FRIEND. HE ALSO WAS ABLE TO COME ON THE WEST VIRGINIA TRIP THIS PAST YEAR AND CONQUERED HIS FEAR OF THE OUTDOORS! HE ENJOYED HIKING, CAVING, AND WHITE WATER RAFTING (ALL ACTIVITIES THAT HE NEVER WOULD HAVE TRIED WITHOUT HIS ASC FAMILY!)
